It has been a good year working with the folks in this area, much was accomplished for the Lord. In May we started building a house for Marvin Brown and his family, they had lost all they had when their house burnt to the ground in February. The Lord sent teams with the right skills and funds to build the house. Marvin and his family worked hard with us so they could be in the house in September, they are thanking God as they spent Christmas in a new warm home. More mines have closed last year, some miners moved away to find work and others who want to stay here can't find work. The need for help with housing continues, many folks that we have helped in the past are in good shape but there are many who's houses are falling apart. In addition to helping the Browns last year we were able to help many others with their homes, building ramps, fixing roofs, and floors.

Another big change for us was that we moved our surplus store from Lynch to the old Union Hall in Cumberland. It was a huge undertaking that took 6 weeks, with the help of our October teams and friends in the community we are now set up in a more organized and cleaner building. We are also closer to those who need our help with the supplies we offer.

Linda and I have been here for almost 15 years, we have served many in this area and met many from the Churches who come here to help. We have seen lives changed because of the home improvements and the eternal impact we see as teams share the gospel and God's love. With changes we experienced this past year with the store, wood shop, and personal support we see that we have to rely on God even more as we seek His plan for us.
