Sexual Integrity Timeline

The earlier you have these conversations, the better! Children are being exposed to pornography earlier and earlier to younger ages.

At Brookwood we wait to have these conversations, so parents can have them first! We do not talk about sex in our large groups until students are in grade 7.

- Who is responsible for leading these conversations? (Mom or Dad)

- 3. Which resource will we use as a tool to help guide the conversation?

ELEMENTARY AGE CHILDREN

- Boundaries for Private Parts.
- Purpose of Marriage and Sex.
- Instruct on Healthy Relationships especially friendships.

MIDDLE SCHOOL AGE CHILDREN

- Conversations about puberty and the changes that are happening.
- God is changing their body into an adult.
- Listen and ask questions as well!

HIGH SCHOOL AGE CHILDREN

- Boundaries in dating.
- Spouse prospecting.
- · Listen and ask questions.
- Be vulnerable especially in the area of sex, including failures.

If you are divorced, even if you are not in the same home, you need to be on the same page about who is having the conversations.

REMINDERS

- It's more than one conversation.
- Pick who is responsible for leading the conversations.
- Pick your language.
- Pick your resource.
