## Soul Training: Creating Space for God's Spirit to Work

Read <u>Romans 8:26-27</u>. Pause in silence throughout the week and ask the Holy Spirit what He is praying for you. Listen quietly for God to reveal Himself. Rather than jumping right in and asking God for what you think you need, use this time to allow God to guide the conversation. Make this a regular practice as you create space for God's Spirit to work in your life.
