Conversation Starters

What are some ways our culture fosters impatience?

Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

Read Romans 12:12 and Colossians 3:12.

- 1. In what area of your life are you struggling to demonstrate patience? Is there a particular person with whom you find it difficult to be patient?
- 2. How does your impatience manifest itself: Anger? Annoyance? Sarcasm? Judgment? Discontentment?
- 3. What's the underlying reason for your impatience: Pride? Control? Comfort? Fear? Selfishness? Distrust?
- 4. How have you seen patience/impatience affect relationships in your life?

Patience is a must for deepening our bond with others, but patience is also essential in our relationship with God.

Read <u>Psalm 40:1-5</u>. (See also <u>Psalm 37:7</u>; <u>Romans 15:4-5</u>; <u>Hebrews 10:35-36</u>)

- 5. What was the writer of this Psalm experiencing while he was *waiting patiently* for the Lord? Was it easy?
- 6. What came as a result of the Psalmist waiting patiently?
- 7. Describe a time in your life when waiting on God was really difficult.

One way we can grow in patience is to understand and experience God's amazing patience with us.

Read Psalm 103:8-11.

- 8. How does this passage describe God?
- 9. Describe a time you experienced God like this.
- 10. What practical steps can you take this week to receive more of God's mercy, compassion and patience?
- 11. What's your biggest takeaway from this week's teaching?
