- 7. What does it mean to worship God with all your heart? Give examples of what this looks like.
- 8. In your own words, what's the difference between attending worship and living in worship?
- 9. In light of this chapter in Samuel, how is the work of Jesus Christ good news for us?

10. How can you apply the truth of this week's teaching to your life?
