Conversation Starter

What is the difference between confidence and arrogance?

Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

Read 1 Samuel 13:1-7.

- 1. Describe the situation Saul and Jonathan were facing. In a sentence or two, summarize this opening scene (vs. <u>1-5</u>).
- 2. How did the Israelites respond to what was happening (vs. 6-7)?

Read <u>1 Samuel 13:8-14</u>.

- 3. What did Saul do when things weren't going as planned (vs. 8-9)?
- 4. How did Saul try to justify his actions (vs. 11-12)?
- 5. What weaknesses are we beginning to see in Saul (vs. <u>13-14</u>)?

Read 1 Samuel 15:1-11.

- 6. What did the Lord command Saul to do (vs. 1-3)?
- 7. What did Saul do instead, and how did this affect his relationship with both God and Samuel (vs. 4-11)?

Read <u>1 Samuel 15:16-31</u>.

8. What did Samuel name as the root of Saul's problem (vs. 17)?

- 9. As you reflect back over these two episodes in Saul's life, how did insecurity and a low view of himself lead to disobedience, fear and defensiveness? How did these show up throughout the stories?
- 10. Jesus is the perfect King. Unlike Saul, Jesus obeyed the Father and carried out His mission perfectly. How does the Good News of Jesus Christ enable us to live in greater obedience to God?

Soul Training: Learning to Live in Our New Identity

God is not only the King of the universe, He is also a deeply kind and loving Father. He sent Jesus to make us His sons and daughters (<u>2 Corinthians 6:18</u>; <u>Galatians 4:4-7</u>; <u>1 John 3:2</u>). Because of Jesus, we no longer have to carry the burden of shame and guilt.
