Conversation Starters

When you think about God, what are the first words that come to mind?

Personal Reflection/Group Discussion

- 1. Describe the impossible situations people were experiencing in Psalm 107:1-15. What are some ways God showed His goodness? Can you relate to any of this? *Explain*...
- 2. The Bible declares that *God is good* (or some form of that phrase) several hundred times (see <u>Psalm 34:8</u>; <u>145:7-9</u>; <u>Hosea 3:5</u>; <u>Acts 14:16-17</u>). What does it mean that *God is good*?
- 3. Have you ever doubted God's goodness? Maybe you believed God was holding out on you, that you were missing out on something. What was that like? How do you usually respond in times like that? How does God want you to respond?
- 4. How would your life be different if you were totally convinced to the core of your being *God is good* and *He is for you*?
- 5. Summarize the truth of <u>Luke 6:43-45</u> (see also <u>1 Peter 2:9</u>).
- 6. What do these passages teach us about doing good to others?
 - a. Luke 6:35-36
 - b. 2 Corinthians 9:6-10
 - c. Galatians 6:7-10
